

**Assistant/Associate Director, RCPSC-EM Residency Program, Vancouver Island | Department of Emergency Medicine**

The Department of Emergency Medicine at The University of British Columbia (UBC), Vancouver, Canada, invites applications for a part-time Assistant Director of the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada (RCPSC) Emergency Medicine (EM) Residency Program at the Vancouver Island site. **This is a 0.10 FTE position (1/2 day per week) for a four-month term with the possibility of renewal or promotion to the role of Associate Director (0.25 FTE) effective July 1, 2022**, subject to satisfactory review, and is expected to be filled by a candidate internal to the University.

The vision of the UBC Department of Emergency Medicine is to be a provincially integrated Department committed to clinical, academic, and health care delivery leadership, founded in the creation and exchange of knowledge to improve emergency care. Our faculty members across the province have an impressive record of research and discovery related to prevention of emergencies, improving clinical care, and system improvements. Our Royal College residency training program, distributed across four program sites, is the largest in the country providing high-quality emergency training. The Department of Emergency Medicine has also played a leadership role in the development and implementation of the BC Emergency Medicine Network which integrates and translates knowledge and experiences to support emergency practitioners across the province.

The Assistant Director, RCPSC-EM Residency Program, Vancouver Island will report to the Associate Director, RCPSC-EM Residency Program, Vancouver Island and will support the day-to-day administration of the Department of Emergency Medicine's residency program at the Vancouver Island site. They will support the continued transition to Competency Based Medical Education and work closely with residents to ensure training milestones are being met. The Assistant Director will provide leadership in assigned areas of curriculum development, and support a number of programmatic activities. They will ensure a supportive learning environment is created at the Vancouver Island site that enables trainees to thrive and have a superior educational experience. **The Assistant Director will take on increasing responsibility for various aspects of the program over the four-month term culminating in a transition to the role of Associate Director for the Vancouver Island site upon mutual agreement.**

Applicants must be certified in Emergency Medicine by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of BC and be licensed by the BC College of Physicians and Surgeons. The successful candidate will be a collaboratively spirited colleague with a demonstrated ability to effectively communicate and interact with empathy, understanding, and respect of diverse and divergent perspectives and behaviours. They will have a record of accomplishments that demonstrates commitment to medical education and continuous quality improvement, and evidence of ability in teaching. Expertise and/or certification in education will be considered an asset. A faculty appointment in the Department of Emergency Medicine and a hospital appointment as an emergency physician at Victoria General Hospital or Royal Jubilee Hospital will be required.
